



Scholarship funds top MBA course



Wellington IT specialist Joshua Feast (right) is the first recipient of New Zealand's most valuable scholarship to the US, the Fulbright-Platinum Triangle Scholarship in Entrepreneurship. The \$US100,000 scholarship will enable him to complete an MBA at the MIT Sloan School of Management, Boston, a business school internationally recognised for its educational development of innovative managers. The scholarship is personally funded by US ambassador Charles Swindells and other private philanthropists in the US and New Zealand. It includes travel and will fund Mr Feast through the entire MIT course. An internship component will offer him practical experience in the US during and after the completion of his two years of study. He will also be supported on his return to New Zealand, either to start his own business or to find employment.
